On the evening of Wednesday, January 9th, from 6:30 to 7:30, I will be hosting a Parent-Principal Coffee featuring the topic of, "Assessment." At that time, I will present information regarding various forms of assessment used at Hunting Ridge and how that information assists teachers in shaping their lessons. Dear Hunting Ridge Parents and Guardians,

Hunting Ridge Elementary School is pleased to announce the second year of our RAINBOWS program. We will be offering RAINBOWS support groups for our students (kindergarten-sixth grade) who have experienced a significant loss or change. This winter, we will be offering a 12-week session. Support groups will be held over the lunch/recess hour, once per week.

When something significant happens in a family, the entire family is affected. Even though death, divorce or other loss issues appear to be only grown-up problems, they do have a profound effect on the children that are touched by these experiences. If a parent dies or a divorce happens or a painful loss occurs, not only do the parents grieve, the children do also. Because of their age and short life experience, children may find it extremely difficult to verbalize their feelings of grief.

Here at Hunting Ridge Elementary School, we have several sensitive, caring, trained adults who have said "yes" to helping these children put their feelings into words, work through their grief, build a stronger sense of self-esteem, and begin to accept what has taken place in the family.

If your child is part of a single parent family, a stepfamily, has experienced the death of a loved family member, friend or sibling, or is struggling through a painful experience, this will be an opportunity for him/her to share in a small group setting of similar age peer who may be experiencing similar circumstances.

2012 Illinois State Report Cards now available online

The 2012 Illinois State Report Cards are now available for viewing on the District 15 website.

The Illinois State Report Cards include information about schools' academic performances, as well as demographics and statistics regarding their student populations and instructional settings, and comparisons of how all of those figures relate to District and state averages.

The report cards also indicate if schools made Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) toward meeting the goal of the federal No Child Left Behind (NCLB) legislation for all students to meet or exceed standards in reading and mathematics by 2014. Each year, the state calculates a school's adequate yearly progress by determining the percentage of students within each school meeting or exceeding state standards as measured by the Illinois Standards Achievement Test. This year, Illinois received a waiver to freeze its

AYP target at a requirement that 85 percent of all students and all qualifying demographic subgroups meet or exceed state standards in reading and math. Without the waiver, the requirement would have increased 7.5 percentage points to a benchmark of 92.5 percent.

According to the Illinois State Board of Education, only a third of the state's 3,786 schools made AYP this year. Here in District 15, eight of the District's 19 reporting schools met that 85 percent AYP goal in reading while 14 did so in math. In all, the following eight schools met the AYP requirements for both reading and math in the "all" category and for every subgroup:

- Frank C. Whiteley School
- Stuart R. Paddock School
- Hunting Ridge School
- Thomas Jefferson School
- Marion Jordan School
- Willow Bend School
- Pleasant Hill School
- Plum Grove Junior High

In particular, notable improvements across the board were seen in the test results from Stuart R. Paddock, Thomas Jefferson, and Kimball Hill School.

Kimball Hill and Jane Addams Schools were required to provide School Choice and Supplemental Educational Services (SES) per NCLB guidance. AYP, SES, and School Choice are all part of the NCLB guidance enacted in 2001. The federal government, which was to have reauthorized NCLB in 2007, has yet to act on new legislation and/or guidance. The Elementary and Secondary Education Act will likely become the new guidance within the next year or so. Preliminary feedback has indicated that, while still preserving the access to a quality education for all students and each demographic subgroup, the new guidance will focus on growth and incentives as opposed to pre-established targets and punitive consequences. Until the District receives updated guidance from the federal and/or state level, it will continue to follow NCLB guidance under the direction of the Illinois State Board of Education.
