Books contain structured argument, generally leading from an introduction to chapters that make and support specific points, and concluding with a discussion that draws conclusions. Learn the conventions of your discipline. This is especially true when it comes to taking notes in class. It may be less true for taking notes from reading. The challenge of handwritten notes is that some academics, myself included, have poor handwriting that is quickly illegible.
